- *Announcements: The North Coast Community News page has been established on Facebook; still have vacancies for positions in Districts 2 & 3; BOS meetings can now be accessed by the public via Zoom.*
- *No actual Sherriff's report, but Deborah had information that there were 62 calls in May. Types were not broken down.*
- *No CHP report until next month.*
- *Basin Management Report by Dan Heimel/Final Draft 2025: Upper aquifer still needs treatment due to nitrates. Lower aquifer still has high levels of saltwater intrusion. Due to conservation and recycling, water usage has been cut by almost 1/2 since 2000. New monitoring well at 5th and Pismo (Sweet Springs Well) should be operational by the end of 2026; AG usage of water is obtained still be using estimates; the BOS would have to dictate farmers for actual monitoring by test equipment. Supervisor Gibson remarked that this has been discussed with AG entities in the past and was deemed to be too expensive for the AG people to implement.*
- *Supervisor Gibson congratulated the citizens of Los Osos for the passage of B-26 (Sunnyside School Purchase), and he also congratulated Jim Dantona on his District 2 victory. Gibson also reiterated his position on ICE, basically saying that SLO should only offer legally limited help to that organization.*
- *Casey Kinman introduced herself as the head of the North County Farmers Market Group; she stated that they are keeping on top of how the proposed construction on the lot at 2nd Street and Santa Maria Avenue (Benson Project) would affect the Baywood Farmer's Market that is held in that area.*
- *Land Use Committee approved the Tucker Deck Project; they also are requesting applicants to increase membership regarding the Land Use Committee.*
- *The ending balance for the LOCAC account was \$2,647.19.*
- *Tree and Landscape Committee are working to try to get an irrigation pipe installed under the sidewalk at the front of the Community Park for watering future planting of trees there.*
- *The Transportation Committee announced the Family Bike Ride to be held on 6/27 at 10AM in Baywood Park; also announced plans for the development of a pedestrian/bike trail (Quail Hollow Trail) to connect the dead end on Ferrel Street to Ramona Avenue to maximize access to Downtown Baywood Park.*
- *LOCAC is attempting to change the bylaws regarding elections, doing away with the secret ballot stipulation in favor of a regular voting format.*
- *LOCAC is also going to redesign its website to make it more user-friendly, completion date TBD.*
