Agenda Item 9A – May 3, 2018 Board Meeting District /CAL FIRE Chief Report for April 2018

EMERGENCY ACTIVITY

- 1. Station 15 South Bay responded to 102 calls between March 27-April 23, including 63 Medical Aids and 3 Traffic Collisions; 3 incidents were reported as Fire, 4 as Hazardous; 26 as Public Service Assists.
- 2. Company 15 was called to cover the station or respond to emergencies between March 27-April 23 a total of 6 times.

ADMINISTRATION

- 3. Station 15 South Bay staff continued the budget preparation process through the month of April. Time was spent ensuring that the current budget was accurate and valid to provide a solid foundation for the next fiscal year budget.
- 4. On April 11th and 25th, Office Assistant Rohner attended all-day computer software training courses with the County of San Luis Obispo.
- 5. From April 24-27th, Office Assistant Brown attended the Annual California Fire Chief's Association Administrative Fire Services Section (AFSS) in Santa Cruz, CA. AFSS serves as a resource network for fire professionals to increase proficiency, enhance professional status, promotes educational opportunities and encourages leadership development. This training was paid for by CAL FIRE.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS/PROJECTS

6. In April, Station 15 – South Bay Fire continued preparing for two upcoming chipping events. These events are funded via multiple grants through the SLO County Community Fire Safe Council, NFPA and State Farm Insurance. The first event is a 5-day door-to-door chipping event that is available to homeowners in the State Responsibility Area and will occur May 7-10; this event provides a crew and chipper, free of charge, to residents who have cut and stacked vegetation near roadways. The crew will not cut any new vegetation or provide clearance. Door hangers were distributed in April by community volunteers and Reserve Firefighters. Our thanks goes out to community members Emily Miggins, Tom Wright and Eileen Murta for their volunteer efforts.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS/PROJECTS

- 7. The second Chipping Event is Neighborhood Chipping and will occur on May 5-11; participants can drop off their debris at two different locations in town. If you'd like more information on either of the events mentioned, please visit www.losososcsd.org or call us at (805) 764-1053.
- 8. In April, Station 15 South Bay Fire Staff continued planning and preparing to host a "Family and Friends" CPR Class to be held on May 13th from 6-8:30 pm at the South Bay Community Center. This is a free course to Los Osos residents who are 16 years of age or older. "Friends and Family" CPR teaches Hands-Only CPR, CPR with breaths and clearing airway blocks.
 - Family & Friends CPR is for people who want to learn CPR but do not need a CPR course completion card to meet a job requirement. This course is ideal for community groups, new parents, grandparents, babysitters, and others interested in learning how to save a life. - 9. During the month of April, the new Medic Squad 15 was in the North County Shop for final installation of racks, shelving and other necessary work. This new vehicle has been equipped with all of the proprietary emergency equipment. As the primary response engine to MDO, this new vehicle seats 4 people and is equipped with Advanced Life Support and Rescue equipment that will serve the community for many years to come.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS/PROJECTS

- 10. On April 21st, Station 15 South Bay Fire joined together in front of the Fire Station to update the Department Photo. The photo is taken bi-annually to exemplify the pride and honor that the 30+ employees who work at the fire station share in service of the Los Osos Community. It will be on display for the public in the front office.
- 11. On April 25th, in celebration of Administrative Professional Day, the Station 15 South Bay Fire on-duty crew celebrated Executive Assistants Harmony Brown and Holly Rohner. Harmony and Holly are vital team members to the Fire Department and we are grateful for their teamwork and expertise.
- 12. In late April, Station 15 South Bay advertised on Craigslist and sent out press releases to several media outlets regarding new applicants for our Reserve Company. The application deadline is Monday, May 21, 2018.

TRAINING

13. On April 10th, all eight Reserve Firefighter candidates successfully attended the Intro to Diablo Canyon and Hazard Awareness Course. This eight hour, onsite course provides an overview of plant operations, essential systems, potential accident scenarios, and other important information when responding to the Diablo Canyon Power Plant.
