Accept San Luis Obispo County Community Fire Safe Council Grant Award in the Amount

of \$11,350

DESCRIPTION

This Staff Note requests the approval to receive a grant award by San Luis Obispo County Community Fire Safe Council (SLOCCFSC) and approve Staff's spending proposal.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Board adopt the following motion:

Motion: I move that the Board accept a grant award not to exceed \$11,350 from SLOCCFSC toward expenses related to the Chipping Event to be held from May 7, 2018-May 11, 2018.

DISCUSSION

In February 2018, Station 15 – South Bay Fire submitted a grant request to the San Luis Obispo County Community Fire Safe Council to fund a 4-day Door-to-Door Chipping Event in very high wildland fire severity zones within Los Osos and a 2-day Community-Wide Chipping Event at centralized locations. This project is scheduled to occur in early May 2018 and will provide residents the opportunity to manage their vegetation and create or maintain a 100 feet of defensible space.

In accordance with LOCSD Fire Code, Chapter 4.04.00 *Fire Hazards/Weed and Waste Matter Abatement,* CAL FIRE/Station 15 – South Bay intends to utilize CCC Handcrews, Los Osos Community Services District employees and equipment, CAL FIRE/South Bay Fire County contract employees, Los Osos Fire Safe Focus Group members, San Luis Obispo County Sheriff's Honor Farm and local community members to complete this fuel reduction effort prior to summer fire activity and fire weather conditions. A particular focus will be directed to the Cabrillo Estates area and the southern roadways of Highland Drive and Las Encinas Drive.

All SLOCCFSC grants are matching fund grants with SLOCCFSC providing funding for a percentage of the project and the remainder must be provided by the project sponsor through either cash expenditures toward the project or by providing "IN KIND" value contributions. IN KIND contributions can include fire agency or property owner labor. Cash expended by the project sponsor or documented personnel expenses by fire agency counts as dollar for dollar match.

The San Luis Obispo County Fire Safe Council is pleased to support the Los Osos Community Services District 2018 Chipping Project request for \$11,350 in grant funds.

These grants require an equal 50/50 match in either direct expenses incurred or "in kind" value. "In Kind" match value is the federally recognized volunteer rate of \$24/hour and can be provided by citizens, agencies, and volunteers from the community that participate in the project by either coordinating or creating defensible space at their property.

It is our understanding there will be two (2) types of events: a neighborhood curbside chipping project and a separate centralized community chipping event. We have funds available to support these 2 events, however they are from 2 different grant programs and we need you to track expense, match and activities separately.

NEIGHBORHOOD CURBSIDE CHIPPING:

The neighborhood dooryard project funds come from a CAL FIRE SRA Fire Prevention Fund grant in the amount of \$6,000. Match value of \$6,000 required.

CENTRALIZED COMMUNITY CHIPPING:

The centralized community chipping project funds come from a federal grant from the US Forest Service in the amount of \$ 5,350. Match value of \$ 5,350 required.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION:

Funds come from 2 separate grant programs and we need you to track expense, match and activities separately where possible. Where expenses are shared for both events and inseparable (e.g. advertising) we will split the expense equally.

Expenses:

The San Luis Obispo County Fire Safe Council will pay direct expenses for CCC chipping crews, advertising, and banners <u>up the value of the grant allocation</u>. Please provide legible copies of any expense incurred and bids received for selection of vendors. Expenses that exceed the grant allocation will be the responsibility of the Los Osos CSD and can count as match value for the project.

Match:

Documentation is required to support match value. Signup sheets for neighborhood properties chipped that show address, # of hours of labor to create defensible space, any expenses paid by the property owners to achieve defensible space, and signature from property representative. (attach 1)

Funding Acknowledgement:

Both grant funding sources require advertising and printed material mention funding sources. We can provide specific language for inclusion.

The San Luis Obispo County Fire Safe Council is a 501.c.3 Non-Profit organization.
