Public Hearing to adopt Ordinance No. 2022-02 of the Los Osos Community Services District to Amend Tile 1 to Include the Provisions of the Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act in District Code.



#### California Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act (Act)

- Passed and codified in 1983
- Only applies to public projects, not maintenance work
- Provides jurisdictions with a uniform cost accounting standard for construction work performed or contracted by local public agencies.
- A Commission to oversee and enforce provisions of the Act was established to develop the uniform public construction cost accounting procedures.



#### California Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act (Act)

- The District qualifies as a "public agency" under the Act.
- Today, there are over 300 special districts alone, not counting other public agencies, who are participating member agencies.
- Benefit can be measured by the time and cost saving when pursuing Public Works projects



DOLLAR AMOUNT	PROCUREMENT METHOD
\$0-\$60,000	May be performed by LOCSD employees by force account, by negotiated contract, or by purchase order.
\$60,001-\$200,000	Contract by informal procedures as set forth in the Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act. Board Approval of Contract Required.
\$200,001+	Contract by formal procedures as set forth in the Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act. Board Approval of Contract Required.

#### General Action Items

Water Supply Resiliency Intertie Project



#### **Background**

- County Regional Water Infrastructure Resiliency Plan completed in 2021, which ranked Los Osos as one of the top five most vulnerable communities for future water supplies because of its single source, local groundwater.
- September 2021, Board provided direction to investigate alternative water supply resiliency projects.



#### **Background**

- The Plan identified the State Water Project and Whale Rock Reservoir as two options
- Staff focused on the Chorro Valley State Water Project pipeline as the preferred alternative



#### Conceptual Strategy

- Utilize supplemental water to help, in the short-term, balance and add long-term resiliency to the groundwater basin
- Use State Water or other water sources when available to offset aquifer use during wet years to allow recharge
- Continue to implement the Basin Plan strategies

#### **Project Components**

- Intertie pipeline
- Securing supplemental State Water



#### Intertie Pipeline Component – Tech Memo Summary

- •12" pipe, approximately 2.5 miles
- Two creek crossings
- Pipeline alignment on South Bay Blvd. from Santa Ysabel to Highway 1
- 3 options were considered at Highway 1



#### Intertie Pipeline Component


- Design would be for the delivery of approx. 200 acrefeet of water per year
- Future additional water needs could be served as well



#### Intertie Pipeline Component – 3 options

- Option 1 (preferred)- turn easterly on Quintana Road before crossing under Highway 1
- Option 2- turn westerly on Quintana Road before crossing under Highway 1 (utility congestion)
- •Option 3- extending the pipeline under the overpass at Highway 1 (utility congestion)

- Secure a portion of the County's unallocated State Water allocation

#### Motion: I move the Board direct staff to:


- 1. Send a correspondence to the County expressing the District's interest in acquiring State Water;

- 4. Reallocate \$80,000 of Zone A revenue from Fund 301 to Fund 500 to cover the cost of the environmental work.
